INTRODUCTION

God sent Jesus to save His people from their sins (Matthew 1:21).

Jesus came to the earth to seek and to save that which was lost (Matthew 18:11, Luke 19:10).

God loves the world so much, He gave His Son to mankind. Whoever believes in Jesus shall not perish but have eternal, everlasting life. God sent His Son that the world might be saved (John 3:16-17).

Jesus spoke and revealed truth to the people, that they may be saved (John 5:34). Jesus spoke and said what the Father commanded and told Him to speak and say (John 12:49-50).

Jesus is the bread of life. The Father sent Jesus from heaven to give life to the world. Jesus gave His body on the cross and died for the world. If anyone eats Jesus' flesh, he will live forever. As the living Father sent Jesus, and Jesus lives because of the Father, so he who eats Jesus' flesh will live because of Jesus (John 6).

Jesus is the door. If anyone enters by Him, he will be saved, and will go in and out freely and find pasture and spiritual security (John 10:9, NKJV & Amplified). Jesus is the good shepherd (John 10:11).

Jesus did not come to judge the world. Jesus came to save the world (John 12:47).



Jesus is the lamb slain before the foundation of the world, an eternal mystery. The Father knew He would send Jesus to die to redeem mankind (Revelation 13:8).

God is holy, perfect and righteous in all His ways (Leviticus 19:2, Matthew 5:48). He cannot even look upon sin or fallen man (Habakkuk 1:13). Therefore, Jesus shed His blood seven times, to save mankind from their sins and fallen condition. Jesus died to give life to the world (John 6:51).

He rose again and lives forevermore.



The subject of this book is so glorious, it is beyond human explanation and description.

The Name of Jesus

Jesus

The name “Jesus” in Hebrew literally means “God saves.” The name “Jesus” in Hebrew is “Yeshua.”

In the Old Testament, Yeshua was an alternative form of the name Yehoshua, Hebrew for Joshua (Numbers 13:16, 1 Chronicles 7:27).

Therefore, Jesus is the Greek form of the Hebrew name Joshua.

The name Yeshua is related to the Hebrew verb root “rescue” and one of its noun forms, yesua, “deliverance.”

Yeshua in Greek is “Iesous,” and in Latin is “Iesus.” The name Jesus in English comes from Iesous and Iesus.

Christ

In the New Testament, which was written in Greek, "Christ" in the Greek is the word "christos," which means "anointed."

In the Old Testament, which was written in Hebrew, the word for "Messiah" is "mashiach," which also means "anointed."

Therefore, the Greek word for Christ, "christos," is the Greek equivalent for the Hebrew word for Messiah, "mashiach."

Therefore, His name could properly be written and spoken as, "Jesus the Anointed One."

TWO

The Messiah

One of the central themes of the Old Testament is the coming Messiah.

Some scholars have found more than 400 places in the Old Testament that refer to the coming Messiah.

Author Paul Humber has found 414 prophecies, appearances, or foreshadowings (PAFs) of Christ in the Old Testament.

This book includes 365 Old Testament prophecies and references to Christ, which are in Chapter 12.

The “Messiah” or “Anointed One”

The word “Messiah” or “Anointed One,” or, in Greek, “Christ,” is found in Psalm 2:2 and

Daniel 9:25-26.

Psalm 2:2: "The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the LORD and against His Anointed, saying . . ."

Daniel 9:25-26:

"Know therefore and understand,
That from the going forth of the command
To restore and build Jerusalem
Until Messiah the Prince,
There shall be seven weeks and sixty-two
weeks;

The street shall be built again, and the wall,
Even in troublesome times.

"And after the sixty-two weeks Messiah shall
be cut off, but not for Himself;

And the people of the prince who is to come
Shall destroy the city and the sanctuary.

The end of it shall be with a flood,

And till the end of the war desolations are de-
termined" (Daniel 9:25-26).

Jesus Said He is the Messiah

In the Book of John, we read that Jesus said He is the Messiah.

In John 4:1-26, Jesus spoke with a Samaritan woman at Jacob's well. It took place in the city of Sychar in Samaria, while Jesus and His disciples traveled from Judea to Galilee.

Jesus broke tradition in speaking with the woman, as Jews had no dealings with Samaritans (v. 9). After asking her for a drink of water, Jesus then told the woman about the “gift of God” and the “living water” (v. 10) that He could give her. In verses 13 and 14, Jesus reveals to her the results of drinking the living water.

Then, Jesus received a word of knowledge about the woman having five husbands and her current man not being her husband.

Following that, Jesus continued to reveal to her deep truths and teachings. He told the woman about salvation being of the Jews and about God being a Spirit. He finished the revelation about the Spirit with this: “God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth” (John 4:24). Then, we read:

“The woman said to Him, ‘I know that Messiah is coming’ (who is called Christ). ‘When He comes, He will tell us all things.’

“Jesus said to her, ‘I who speak to you am He’” (John 4:25-26).

Primary Prophecies of Jesus Christ

Some of the primary prophecies of Jesus Christ the Messiah are:

The Messiah would be the seed/offspring of a woman and would crush the head of Satan – Genesis 3:15

He would be from the tribe of Judah – Genesis 49:10

He would be born at Bethlehem of Judah – Micah 5:2

He would be born of a virgin – Isaiah 7:14

He would have a throne, a kingdom, and a dynasty, or house, starting with King David, that will last forever – 2 Samuel 7:16

Messiah would be tortured to death – Psalm 22:1-31

He would be pierced for our transgression and crushed for our iniquities (Isaiah 53:5)

His life would match a particular description, including suffering, silence at his arrest and trial, death and burial in a rich man's tomb, and resurrection – Isaiah 52:13-53:12

He would die among the wicked ones but be buried with the rich – Isaiah 53:9

He would be resurrected from the grave, for God would not allow His Holy One to suffer decay – Psalm 16:10

THREE

The Names of God

The only true God has one name with many revelations.

In the Old Testament, He reveals Himself with 12 primary revelations of His name. In order, they are:

Elohim – My Creator – Genesis 1:1

Jehovah – My Lord God – Genesis 2:7

Jehovah El-Shaddai – My Supplier – Genesis 17:4

Adonai – My Master – Genesis 18:3

Jehovah Jireh – My Provider – Genesis 22:8

Jehovah Rophe – My Healer – Exodus 15:26

Jehovah Nissi – My Banner – Leviticus 17:15

Jehovah Mikkadesh – My Sanctifier – Leviticus 20:7-8

Jehovah Shalom – My Peace – Judges 6:24

Jehovah Tsidkenu – My Righteousness – Jeremiah 23:5-6

Jehovah Rohi – My Shepherd – Psalm 23:1

Elohim

The first name the Bible introduces is "God," in Genesis 1:1. "God" is translated from "Elohim," which means "Gods." Elohim is the plural of the word "Eloah," which means God.

Therefore, the first verse of the Bible introduces the three-in-one God.

"El" means God. "Elohim" speaks of the "God of glory and might."

The name Elohim declares that He is the God of: authority, majesty, creation, dominion, government, rule, might, and infinitely more.

The name declares who God is. It does not reveal who God is.

In Elohim there is declaration.

Elohim presents God and is connected to His acts. It is not connected to intimacy with Him or to His covenants, sacrifice or relationship.

The word Elohim is found more than 2,500 times in the Old Testament. He existed long before man could know Him as "God the Father."

When God spoke, there is eternal force. His word released eternal power which is still being released throughout the universe.

God's word has an eternal echo. God's word lives. God's word is established forever. Jesus said, "'Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will by no means pass away'" (Matthew 24:35).

In Isaiah, the coming Messiah is called Elohim: "For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; and the government will be upon His shoulder. And His name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6).

The Lord Jesus was there at Creation.

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (John 1:1).

The Greek word for "Word" is *logos*, which means "word, reason, plan." Therefore, it could properly be translated "revelation:" "In the beginning was the revelation, and the revelation was with God, and the revelation was God" (John 1:1).

Jesus is part of the Godhead who came to the earth as a man: "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth" (John 1:14).

Jehovah, LORD God

The next name for God in the Bible is "LORD God," first seen in Genesis 2:4. The "LORD God" is the English translation of the Hebrew "Jehovah Elohim."

Therefore, the simplified English translation for "Lord God" is Jehovah. Remember the name

Jehovah, as future revelations of His name are presented.

The name "LORD God" is found more than 6,000 times in Scripture.

Why is this name revealed? Notice that Genesis 2:4 begins the portion of scripture where we learn about God creating man, which occurs in Genesis 2:7. The LORD God, or Jehovah, is the name of covenant and relationship.

Genesis 2:4-7:

"This is the history of the heavens and the earth when they were created, in the day that the Lord God made the earth and the heavens, before any plant of the field was in the earth and before any herb of the field had grown. For the Lord God had not caused it to rain on the earth, and there was no man to till the ground; 6 but a mist went up from the earth and watered the whole face of the ground.

And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living being"

LORD God

In the Bible, LORD in capital letters is "Jehovah."

There is a holy history and mystery surrounding this name.

This glorious name LORD is translated from the Hebrew YHWH, which is the name God revealed to Moses in Exodus 3.

The name YHWH was so holy to the scribes and Jews, it was not to be read out loud, so they wrote it without vowels.

When they did have to pronounce it, they took the vowels from "Adonai" and inserted them into YHWH. The result is YaHoWaH, or Jehovah.

The Bible presents Jehovah Elohim, because it is through Jehovah – YHWH, or Yahweh – that a divine relationship with man was being established.

Covenant Precedes Power and Glory

When Adam was created, a relationship and a revelation began.

Adam was in God's presence and glory. He was in glorious fellowship with the only true God. Adam was God's partner, replacing the position Lucifer the angel had lost.

Jehovah is the name connected to covenant and relationship. We are sons of Jehovah and sons of Elohim. There is a very big difference between the two, because covenant comes before power, and relationship before authority. What does that mean?

By inspiration of the Holy Spirit, the writers of the Bible wrote this glorious name as the "LORD God" for a divine, holy reason: covenant and relationship come before power and authority. LORD is first. A person can only know God's power, authority, victory and infinitely more, by first having a relationship with Him.

Someone can know God the Creator, Elohim, and know all about Him in that name. They can know and memorize the entire Bible and so forth. But if they do not actually have a relationship with Him, they will not be changed in any way spiritually. They will not know God's power, authority, victory, and all the eternal, glorious things God offers, unless they know Him as Jehovah.

Jehovah reveals God. Jehovah is the name of revelation. Jehovah is connected to covenant.

Jehovah reveals and imparts God.

When someone knows God, then they can obey, surrender, serve, receive and infinitely more.

We receive in Jehovah. The angels know He is God, but they cannot know Him. They are sons of Elohim.

We are sons of Jehovah God.

Once the relationship is established, only then can someone surrender, submit, obey, and more, to Jehovah and the glorious revelations of Him, such as El-Shaddai and Adonai.

Elohim presents glory; Jehovah reveals glory.

Elohim presents love; Jehovah reveals love.

Elohim presents mercy; Jehovah reveals mercy.

Elohim presents grace; Jehovah reveals grace.

Elohim presents power; Jehovah reveals power.

The name Jehovah contains within it the revelation of God Himself.

FOUR

I AM

I AM WHO I AM . . . I AM . . . YHWH

The first time God actually revealed His name to a person was when God revealed His name to Moses in about 1300 BC.

The glorious visitation is recorded in Exodus 3, the burning bush passage. God appeared to Moses and told him He would deliver them from slavery in Egypt.

God appeared to Moses and in “a flame of fire from the midst of a bush” (Exodus 3:2). God said “I am the God of your father – the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob” (Exodus 3:6).

Moses asked God’s name, and God answered him:

Then Moses said to God, “Indeed, when I

come to the children of Israel and say to them, 'The God of your fathers has sent me to you,' and they say to me, 'What is His name?' what shall I say to them?"

14 And God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM." And He said, "Thus you shall say to the children of Israel, 'I AM has sent me to you.'" 15 Moreover God said to Moses, "Thus you shall say to the children of Israel: 'The Lord God of your fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob, has sent me to you. This is My name forever, and this is My memorial to all generations'" (Exodus 3:13-15).

YHWH

The Hebrew for I AM WHO I AM is pronounced "Ehyeh asher ehyeh."

These Hebrew words could be translated as: "I am that I am" or "I will be what I will be" or even "Let it be who Let it be."

Hebrew is a complex language. Part of the first and third words has a "root," which in English is "h-y-h." This root means "to be, to become, to come to pass." It is a form of h-w-h. Experts believe this Hebrew root is the origin of the name YHWH.

YHWH in the Bible

In the original Hebrew Old Testament, the word used most frequently for God is YHWH.

It is used 6,800 times.

This four-letter word YHWH is called the Tetragrammaton. The four letters are: yodh, he, waw and he.

Through the centuries, the word YHWH has been a mystery and puzzle to Bible scholars, as it is today.

The Jewish scribes who copied and recorded manuscripts of the Bible, and Hebrew scholars and Jews through the centuries, felt the name was so holy they did not even pronounce it. In the original manuscripts, they wrote it without the vowels, because it was never to be spoken out loud.

Through the centuries, scholars presented various ways to pronounce YHWH. There is a general debate about how Rabbis and Hebrew scholars pronounced YHWH when they did say God's name. Examples of pronunciations centuries ago are "Yaoweh" and "Yabeh."

What did Jews do when they wanted to read the scriptures aloud? They took the vowels from the Hebrew name "Adonai," which means "Lord" or "Lords" and inserted them in the name to make the name YaHoWaH. This name is pronounced "Jehovah."

YaHoWaH is a combination of "God" and "Lord," and therefore it could safely be translated "Lord God."

"Jesus said to them, 'Most assuredly, I say to you, before Abraham was, I AM' (John 8:58).

FIVE

Names of Jesus

Below are some of the names of Jesus Christ:

ADAM: (1 Corinthians 15:45) And so it is written, The first man Adam was made a living soul; the last Adam was made a quickening spirit.

ADVOCATE: (1 John 2:1) My little children, these things write I unto you, that ye sin not. And if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous:

ALMIGHTY: (Revelation 1:8) I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the ending, saith the Lord, which is, and which was, and which is to come, the Almighty.

ALPHA AND OMEGA: (Revelation 1:8) I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the ending, saith the Lord, which is, and which was, and which is to come, the Almighty.

AMEN: (Revelation 3:14) And unto the angel of the church of the Laodiceans write; These things saith the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of the creation of God;

APOSTLE OF OUR PROFESSION: (Hebrews 3:1) Wherefore, holy brethren, partakers of the heavenly calling, consider the Apostle and High Priest of our profession, Christ Jesus;

ARM OF THE LORD: (Isaiah 51:9) Awake, awake, put on strength, O arm of the LORD; awake, as in the ancient days, in the generations of old. Art thou not it that hath cut Rahab, and wounded the dragon?

(Isaiah 53:1) Who hath believed our report? and to whom is the arm of the LORD revealed?

AUTHOR AND FINISHER OF OUR FAITH: (Hebrews 12:2) Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.

AUTHOR OF ETERNAL SALVATION:

(Hebrews 5:9) And being made perfect, he became the author of eternal salvation unto all them that obey him;

BEGINNING OF CREATION OF GOD: (Revelation 3:14) And unto the angel of the church of the Laodiceans write; These things saith the Amen, the faithful and true witness, the beginning of the creation of God;

BELOVED SON: (Matthew 12:18) Behold my servant, whom I have chosen; my beloved, in whom my soul is well pleased: I will put my spirit upon him, and he shall show judgment to the Gentiles.

BLESSED AND ONLY POTENTATE: (1 Timothy 6:15) Which in his times he shall show, who is the blessed and only Potentate, the King of kings, and Lord of lords;

BRANCH: (Isaiah 4:2) In that day shall the branch of the LORD be beautiful and glorious, and the fruit of the earth shall be excellent and comely for them that are escaped of Israel.

BREAD OF LIFE: (John 6:32) Then Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Moses gave you not that bread from heaven; but my Father giveth you the true bread from heaven.

CAPTAIN OF SALVATION: (Hebrews 2:10)

For it became him, for whom are all things, and by whom are all things, in bringing many sons unto glory, to make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings.

CHIEF SHEPHERD: (1 Peter 5:4) And when the chief Shepherd shall appear, ye shall receive a crown of glory that fadeth not away.

FIRST BEGOTTEN: (Revelation 1:5) And from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, and the first begotten of the dead, and the prince of the kings of the earth. Unto him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood,

FORERUNNER: (Hebrews 6:20) Whither the forerunner is for us entered, even Jesus, made an high priest for ever after the order of Melchisedec.

GLORY OF THE LORD: (Isaiah 40:5) And the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together: for the mouth of the LORD hath spoken it.

GOD: (Isaiah 40:3) The voice of him that crieth in the wilderness, Prepare ye the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

GOD BLESSED: (Romans 9:5) Whose are the fathers, and of whom as concerning the flesh Christ came, who is over all, God blessed for ever. Amen.

GOOD SHEPHERD: (John 10:11) I am the good shepherd: the good shepherd giveth his life for the sheep.

GOVERNOR: (Matthew 2:6) And thou Bethlehem, in the land of Juda, art not the least among the princes of Juda: for out of thee shall come a Governor, that shall rule my people Israel.

GREAT HIGH PRIEST: (Hebrews 4:14) Seeing then that we have a great high priest, that is passed into the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our profession.

HEAD OF THE CHURCH: (Ephesians 1:22) And hath put all things under his feet, and gave him to be the head over all things to the church,

HEIR OF ALL THINGS: (Hebrews 1:2) Hath in these last days spoken unto us by his Son, whom he hath appointed heir of all things, by whom also he made the worlds;

HOLY CHILD: (Acts 4:27) For of a truth against thy holy child Jesus, whom thou hast anointed, both Herod, and Pontius Pilate, with the

Gentiles, and the people of Israel, were gathered together,

I AM: (John 8:58) Jesus said unto them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, Before Abraham was, I am.

IMAGE OF GOD: (2 Corinthians 4:4) In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them.

IMMANUEL: (Isaiah 7:14) Therefore the Lord

himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.

JEHOVAH: (Isaiah 26:4) Trust ye in the LORD for ever: for in the LORD JEHOVAH is everlasting strength:

JESUS: (Matthew 1:21) And she shall bring forth a son, and thou shalt call his name JESUS: for he shall save his people from their sins.

JESUS OF NAZARETH: (Matthew 21:11) And the multitude said, This is Jesus the prophet of Nazareth of Galilee.

JUDGE OF ISRAEL: (Micah 5:1) Now gather thyself in troops, O daughter of troops: he hath laid siege against us: they shall smite the judge of Israel with a rod upon the cheek.

THE JUST ONE: (Acts 7:52) Which of the prophets have not your fathers persecuted? and they have slain them which showed before of the coming of the Just One; of whom ye have been now the betrayers and murderers:

KING: (Zechariah 9:9) Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion; shout, O daughter of Jerusalem: behold, thy King cometh unto thee: he is just, and having salvation; lowly, and riding upon an ass, and upon a colt the foal of

an ass.

KING OF THE AGES: (1 Timothy 1:17) Now unto the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only wise God, be honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

KING OF THE JEWS: (Matthew 2:2) Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him.

KING OF KINGS: (1 Timothy 6:15) Which in his times he shall show, who is the blessed and only Potentate, the King of kings, and Lord of lords;

KING OF SAINTS: (Revelation 15:3) And they sing the song of Moses the servant of God, and the song of the Lamb, saying, Great and marvellous are thy works, Lord God Almighty; just and true are thy ways, thou King of saints.

LAWGIVER: (Isaiah 33:22) For the LORD is our judge, the LORD is our lawgiver, the LORD is our king; he will save us.

LAMB: (Revelation 13:8) And all that dwell upon the earth shall worship him, whose names are not written in the book of life of the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world.

LAMB OF GOD: (John 1:29) The next day John

seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world.

LEADER AND COMMANDER: (Isaiah 55:4) Behold, I have given him for a witness to the people, a leader and commander to the people.

THE LIFE: (John 14:6) Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.

LIGHT OF THE WORLD: (John 8:12) Then spake Jesus again unto them, saying, I am the light of the world: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life.

LION OF THE TRIBE OF JUDAH: (Revelation 5:5) And one of the elders saith unto me, Weep not: behold, the Lion of the tribe of Juda, the Root of David, hath prevailed to open the book, and to loose the seven seals thereof.

LORD OF ALL: (Acts 10:36) The word which God sent unto the children of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ: (he is Lord of all:)

LORD OF GLORY: (1 Corinthians 2:8) Which none of the princes of this world knew: for had they known it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory.

LORD OF LORDS: (1 Timothy 6:15) Which in his times he shall show, who is the blessed and only Potentate, the King of kings, and Lord of lords;

LORD OF OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS: (Jeremiah 23:6) In his days Judah shall be saved, and Israel shall dwell safely: and this is his name whereby he shall be called, **THE LORD OUR RIGHTEOUSNESS.**

MAN OF SORROWS: (Isaiah 53:3) He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was despised, and we esteemed him not.

MEDIATOR: (1 Timothy 2:5) For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus;

MESSENGER OF THE COVENANT: (Malachi 3:1) Behold, I will send my messenger, and he shall prepare the way before me: and the Lord, whom ye seek, shall suddenly come to his temple, even the messenger of the covenant, whom ye delight in: behold, he shall come, saith the **LORD** of hosts.

MESSIAH: (Daniel 9:25) Know therefore and understand, that from the going forth of the commandment to restore and to build

Jerusalem unto the Messiah the Prince shall be seven weeks, and threescore and two weeks: the street shall be built again, and the wall, even in troublous times.

(John 1:41) He first findeth his own brother Simon, and saith unto him, We have found the Messiah, which is, being interpreted, the Christ.

MIGHTY GOD: (Isaiah 9:6) For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.

MIGHTY ONE: (Isaiah 60:16) Thou shalt also suck the milk of the Gentiles, and shalt suck the breast of kings: and thou shalt know that I the LORD am thy Saviour and thy Redeemer, the mighty One of Jacob.

MORNING STAR: (Revelation 22:16) I Jesus have sent mine angel to testify unto you these things in the churches. I am the root and the offspring of David, and the bright and morning star.

NAZARENE: (Matthew 2:23) And he came and dwelt in a city called Nazareth: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophets, He shall be called a Nazarene.

ONLY BEGOTTEN SON: (John 1:18) No man hath seen God at any time; the only begotten Son, which is in the bosom of the Father, he hath declared him.

OUR PASSOVER: (1 Corinthians 5:7) Purge out therefore the old leaven, that ye may be a new lump, as ye are unleavened. For even Christ our passover is sacrificed for us:

PRINCE OF LIFE: (Acts 3:15) And killed the Prince of life, whom God hath raised from the dead; whereof we are witnesses.

PRINCE OF KINGS: (Revelation 1:5) And from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, and the first begotten of the dead, and the prince of the kings of the earth. Unto him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood,

PRINCE OF PEACE: (Isaiah 9:6) For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.

PROPHET: (Luke 24:19) And he said unto them, What things? And they said unto him, Concerning Jesus of Nazareth, which was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people:

(Acts 3:22) For Moses truly said unto the fathers, A prophet shall the Lord your God raise up unto you of your brethren, like unto me; him shall ye hear in all things whatsoever he shall say unto you.

REDEEMER: (Job 19:25) For I know that my redeemer liveth, and that he shall stand at the latter day upon the earth:

RESURRECTION AND LIFE: (John 11:25) Jesus said unto her, I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live:

ROCK: (1 Corinthians 10:4) And did all drink the same spiritual drink: for they drank of that spiritual Rock that followed them: and that Rock was Christ.

ROOT OF DAVID: (Revelation 22:16) I Jesus have sent mine angel to testify unto you these things in the churches. I am the root and the offspring of David, and the bright and morning star.

ROSE OF SHARON: (Song of Songs 2:1) I am the rose of Sharon, and the lily of the valleys.

SAVIOR: (Luke 2:11) For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, which is

Christ the Lord.

SEED OF WOMAN: (Genesis 3:15) And I will put enmity between thee and the woman, and between thy seed and her seed; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel.

SHEPHERD AND BISHOP OF SOULS: (1 Peter 2:25) For ye were as sheep going astray; but are now returned unto the Shepherd and Bishop of your souls.

SHILOH: (Genesis 49:10) The sceptre shall not depart from Judah, nor a lawgiver from between his feet, until Shiloh come; and unto him shall the gathering of the people be.

SON OF THE BLESSED: (Mark 14:61) But he held his peace, and answered nothing. Again the high priest asked him, and said unto him, Art thou the Christ, the Son of the Blessed?

SON OF DAVID: (Matthew 1:1) The book of the generation of Jesus Christ, the son of David, the son of Abraham.

SON OF GOD: (Matthew 2:15) And was there until the death of Herod: that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, Out of Egypt have I called my son.

SON OF THE HIGHEST: (Luke 1:32) He shall be

great, and shall be called the Son of the Highest: and the Lord God shall give unto him the throne of his father David:

SUN OF RIGHTEOUSNESS: (Malachi 4:2) But unto you that fear my name shall the Sun of righteousness arise with healing in his wings; and ye shall go forth, and grow up as calves of the stall.

TRUE LIGHT: (John 1:9) That was the true Light, which lighteth every man that cometh into the world.

TRUE VINE: (John 15:1) I am the true vine, and my Father is the husbandman.

TRUTH: (John 1:14) And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.

WITNESS: (Isaiah 55:4) Behold, I have given him for a witness to the people, a leader and commander to the people.

WORD: (John 1:1) In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

WORD OF GOD: (Revelation 19:13) And he was clothed with a vesture dipped in blood: and his

SIX

God Loves the World

“For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life” (John 3:16).

Sometimes we overlook those words.

As with all of Jesus’ words, these words are eternal, life-giving, priceless and contain eternally deep revelation.

Let’s look at the next verse, John 3:17:

“For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him.”

John 3:16-21: “World” Five Times, “Whoever” Four Times

In John 3:16-21, Jesus says “world” five times and “whoever” four times. He clearly is emphasizing “world” and “whoever.”

“The World, Whoever” and the Predestination Debate

The following is a perspective presented to make a point, though I am not into theology and the debates therein.

Some believe in predestination: that certain people are predestined to be saved, and others cannot be saved; based on scriptures such as Ephesians 1:11 and Romans 8:29-30.

Another camp believes God wants to save everyone, based on scriptures including John 3:16, 2 Peter 3:9 and so forth.

Which perspective is correct? Both. How is

that possible?

The answer is that the predestination issue and everything else in our most holy faith is a glorious, divine mystery. We should not try to "explain everything" and "figure everything out." We are to be in awe of God Almighty and all that He is. Amen!

SEVEN

God Loves the Individual

God loves the world.

And He loves every individual person.

Jesus presented two parables about how God loves the individual: the Parable of the Lost Sheep and the Parable of the Lost Coin.

In the lost sheep parable, a man with 100 sheep loses one. He leaves the 99 to go find the one that was lost.

In the lost coin parable, a woman with ten silver coins loses one. She searches her house carefully until she finds the lost coin.

“Then all the tax collectors and the sinners drew near to Him to hear Him. ² And the Pharisees and scribes complained, saying, ‘This Man receives sinners and eats with them.’ ³ So He spoke this parable to them, saying:

⁴ ‘What man of you, having a hundred sheep,

if he loses one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness, and go after the one which is lost until he finds it? 5 And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing. 6 And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and neighbors, saying to them, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep which was lost!' 7 I say to you that likewise there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine just persons who need no repentance.

The Parable of the Lost Coin

8 'Or what woman, having ten silver coins, if she loses one coin, does not light a lamp, sweep the house, and search carefully until she finds it? 9 And when she has found it, she calls her friends and neighbors together, saying, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found the piece which I lost!' 10 Likewise, I say to you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents'" (Luke 15:1-10).

Jesus Reveals His Love for Mankind

In *We Saw Heaven*, Roberts Liardon describes his visit to heaven. During the visit, Jesus revealed sacred things to him. An excerpt:

As they walked together, Jesus began to weep. Roberts was astounded.

He began to tell Roberts holy, wonderful truth, some of which is too sacred to repeat. But Jesus told him that he could reveal one thing.

Jesus said:

“Roberts, I love my people so much that I would go back to earth, preach my three years over again, and die for just one person. If I had not already paid the price for them, and if I thought they wanted to come to heaven, I would do it all over again.

I would not have to know they would make it. If I just thought they wanted to come, I would do it for them, even if they were the greatest sinner of all”

He said repeatedly, “I love my people so much. Why do people not take me at My word? Do they not know that I have all power in heaven and on earth to back up what I said? It is so easy. I made it so simple. If people would just take me at My word, I will do what I said.”

Then He cried harder and said, “I do not understand why people say they believe I will do something, but when it does not happen in their time, they begin to doubt My word. If they will just believe and say with confidence that I will do it, I will do it at the correct time” (p[. 51-52).

EIGHT

Salvation

Salvation is an eternal mystery and reality.

It is also an eternal revelation.

Why? Salvation is finding eternal life, which is knowing the only true God and Jesus Christ Whom He has sent (John 17:3).

God Himself is a mystery and a reality.

Knowing Him is an eternal revelation.

Instant, Lifelong and Eternal

Salvation is both instant and lifelong – and eternal.

How can it be both – and all three?

With God, things are “both and,” not “either or.”

God is so merciful, that when someone comes to Jesus Christ and He becomes their Lord and Savior, they are saved, instantly. Amen!

At the same time, salvation is lifelong. We live out and work out our salvation our entire life.

And we realize salvation – and everything in our most holy faith – is a glorious mystery . . . the riches of the glory of the mystery, of Jesus Christ in us.

It is a mystery that God would allow us to know Him! What a privilege!

It is a mystery that He would allow us to become His children . . . and to receive the absolutely priceless, eternal gifts He offers.

It is a mystery that we partner with God: we work out our salvation . . . but it is God who works in us to will and to act according to His good purpose. He has given man a free will, and it is up to us how deep we go with Him; yet, He is one who works in us.

The reason we can be saved is a glorious mystery: that God would send Jesus to die for us! For all eternity, we will be in awe of the sacrifice of Jesus, which is the complete and total reason we can be saved.

Moreover, salvation is eternal. We enter into a glorious new life that lasts forever! He is our all in all, our everything. Knowing God is a glorious eternal revelation. In reality, everything from God is eternal.

How to be Saved

“But what does it say? ‘The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart’ (that is, the

word of faith which we preach): 9 that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. 10 For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. 11 For the Scripture says, "Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame." 12 For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek, for the same Lord over all is rich to all who call upon Him. 13 For "whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved" (Romans 10:8-13).

Four Phases of the New Life in Jesus

In the Gospel of John, Jesus teaches that there are four phases of walking with Him.

He also reveals there are three phases of a walk with Him in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No man comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6). He reveals the phases in Chapters 3, 4, and 7. The four phases:

1. Born Again (John 3:3)
2. Born of Water and the Spirit (John 3:5-8)
3. Drink Living Water, It Becomes a Fountain Springing Up Into Everlasting Life (John 4:13-14)
4. Come to Jesus, Drink the Living Water, Believe in Him, Rivers of Living Water Will Flow Out of Your Innermost Being (John 7:37-38)

Born Again and Born of Water and the Spirit

Notice the phases include two “births.”

When someone meets the Holy Spirit, their real, true walk with God begins.

It is fascinating Jesus used the term “born.” We know that when a human is born on the earth, they are not a functioning human yet. They rely on others for numerous years.

The same applies spiritually. When someone is born again, they are alive but not really an “independent” follower of Jesus, yet. There is a divine mystery surrounding our entire most holy faith.

When they meet the Holy Spirit, they are born another time. They are going deeper with God.

First Phase

Scripture for the Three Phases and the Initial Phase

Initial Phase – Born Again

“Jesus answered and said to him, ‘Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God’ (John 3:3).

First Phase

Born of Water and the Spirit, One Can Enter the Kingdom of God (1)

“Jesus answered, “Most vassuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, ‘You must be born again.’ The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear the sound of it, but cannot tell where it comes from and where it goes. So is everyone who is born of the Spirit” (John 3:5-8)

Second Phase

Drink Living Water, It Becomes a Fountain Springing Up Into Everlasting Life (2)

“Jesus answered and said to her, ‘If you knew the gift of

God, and who it is who says to you, ‘Give Me

a drink,' you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water.'

The woman said to Him, "Sir, You have nothing to draw with, and the well is deep. Where then do You get that living water? Are You greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well, and drank from it himself, as well as his sons and his livestock?"

Jesus answered and said to her, "Whoever drinks of this water will thirst again, but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life" (John 4:10-14)

Third Phase

Come to Jesus, Drink the Living Water, Believe in Him, Rivers of Living Water Will Flow Out of Your Innermost Being (3)

"On the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried out, saying, 'If anyone thirsts, let him come to Me and drink. He who believes in Me, as the Scripture has said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.' But this He spoke concerning the Spirit, whom those believing in Him would receive; for the Holy Spirit was not yet given, because Jesus was not yet glorified" (John 7:37-39).

NINE

Jesus: an Eternal Revelation

Jesus Christ is the Lord God Almighty.
And, Jesus Christ is the Son of God.
And, He is infinitely, eternally more. Amen!
The following is impossible to put into human words, but it is an attempt:

The revelation of the only true God, the great God Jehovah, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, is certainly the most important revelation in the universe.

Within that revelation, the revelation of Jesus is also the most important revelation in the universe.

A Person's Eternal Destiny

A person's eternal destiny depends on their response to the only true God's offer of Himself

through Jesus Christ.

God has offered the Lord Jesus to every person. It is the greatest and only offer to mankind.

God wants to save all people. He wants everyone to spend eternity with Him in heaven (2 Peter 3:9 & many others).

The tragedy is that most people will not find Jesus as Lord and Savior.

If anyone says no to Jesus, God cannot do anything more for them.

God has done everything He can do to save mankind.

He sent His only Son to the earth to die for the world!

Jesus rose from the dead and lives forevermore. God sent the Holy Spirit to the earth.

Jesus – the Lord God Almighty – is available to every person, all the time, everywhere they go, for all eternity!

What else could God do for mankind?

How Can Jesus be Both God and the Son of God?

Who are we to question God?

One should never cross-question God Almighty.

We should honor and fear Him.

We should humble ourselves before Him.

We should be in awe of Him.

We should be in awe of His offer of Himself through Jesus!

Objections

Some object and say, "Jesus cannot be both God and the Son of God . . ." and "Jesus was a man but he cannot be God also . . ." and other similar objections.

Those who object are a son. Every person on earth has parents.

And they also may be a father – they might have a child or children.

So, which are they, a son or a father? They are both.

And, they are many others things, potentially a: brother, grandfather, friend, nephew, uncle, citizen (of a place), professional, student, hobbyist, and many other "titles."

So it is with Jesus Christ. He has many, many names and titles.

How is it that man has numerous "titles?" Because God created man into His own image and likeness. God has many, many names, offices, titles and descriptions, and so it is with man.

God has done everything He can do to save mankind.

He gave His only Son Jesus to die for the world!

He has offered Himself.

He has offered all that is listed above.

He offers Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit, and infinitely, eternally more.

God's Compassion for All People

The fact that Jesus died for the world is more than enough to reveal God's divine, eternal compassion for all people.

Jesus has revealed in recent times more proof of His love and compassion for all, including those lost in hell.

Jesus Sheds Tears for the Lost

In *Divine Revelation of Hell*, by Mary Baxter, Jesus shed His tears numerous times for those lost in hell.

Jesus took Baxter to hell and to heaven, to reveal the places the saved and lost go after the earth life.

In the midst of their visits, after speaking to those lost in hell, Jesus shed tears of compassion. Jesus said to her:

“God, our Father, gave each one of us a will so that we could choose whether we would serve Him or Satan. You see, God did not make hell for His people. “Those include the tears in my eyes, Jesse. On that great Judgment Day, I will have to tell some of the creation I love to depart from me. I dread that day. I dread it! I dread it! Jesse, it’s final. I can’t change it. Tears flowed from my eyes the day my creation, Adam, fell. But I knew I would send myself. I had a chance to touch people. But that day is coming, and it’s final. Once it’s said, I can’t change it. I have to wipe the tears from my eyes. Tell them I’m coming, Jesse” (p. 127-128).
